Dear Lew:

In accordance with our phone conversation last Friday I attach herewith what I think are the salient facts that should go out in a release to Bill Huggins for the June issue of the Transactions of the Professional Group on Circuit Theory. His address is Dr. W. H. Huggins, Department of Electrical Engineering, The Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore 18, Md.

There are two comments about the material attached that might be of interest. The first has to do with the sponsorship. I have informal assurances from Dr. H. Carlin, Chairman of PGCT and M. S. Corrington, Chairman of the Philadelphia Section that they will cosponsor the 1958 meeting, and I hope to get the remaining details of the sponsorship, including the approval of the AIEE and University of Pennsylvania people within the next two weeks. The other item to note is the closing date for papers which I have chosen arbitrarily, subject to the approval of the other members of the National Committee. It is my thought that the release should go out in spite of these two items since, if necessary (although unlikely), the material can be changed in galley proof.


Huggins has offered us a page in the Transactions if we need it, but I will leave the length and all other details of the announcement to your judgement. As I mentioned to you on the phone, however, time seems to be very short to make the June issue, so I will appreciate your prompt attention to the task. Perhaps you have some thoughts about releases to other publications that will help us get papers and attendance. If so, I would welcome suggestions.

I look forward with a great deal of enthusiasm to what can be accomplished in the 1958 Conference. As I mentioned to you on the phone, I think that we need a strong public relations campaign for the event regardless of the activities of the other committees. I believe, however, that we may use your experience in many connections with this event, not only in the important one of getting our story to the public. One problem that needs your help more or less immediately is the one involving distribution of technical material in some sort of pamphlet at the Conference. I hope to discuss this in detail with you soon.

Thanks again for your willingness to help out with the 1958 Conference. I know that your guidance will be vital to the success of the event.
